LITTLE EMILY PARK GRAND OPENING

Crow Wing County is nearing completion of the Little Emily Lake Park on Little Emily Lake north of The City of Emily. The County will host the grand opening of the Little Emily Park on August 8th, 2024 at 12:00 pm. The park is located at 21517 Papoose Road Emily MN. From the City of Emily, proceed north on State Highway 6 for approximately 4 miles. The access road into the park will be on your right (east) just after the Wigwam Motel. Proceed down the access road for an additional 1.5 miles to the parking lot. The public is encouraged to attend.

On February 14, 2023, the Crow Wing County Board of Commissioners unanimously passed a resolution creating the park. Work quickly progressed at the park due to a mild winter and favorable conditions. The park features a 150' wide swimming beach, a fishing pier, playground, two pavilions, a canoe/kayak launch, numerous interpretive opportunities and 3.25 miles of non-motorized walking trails.

The grand opening will begin at 12pm with a ribbon cutting followed by tours of the park and trails. For more information, please contact Land Services at (218) 824-1010 or at landservices@crowwing.gov
