Portable Tree Stands to be Removed from County Managed Public Land

Crow Wing County Land Services is reminding hunters that all portable tree stands or free standing stands must be removed from County managed public lands no later than one day following the close of Minnesota's big game hunting season.

Portable tree stands or portable free standing stands not removed from County managed public lands are considered abandoned personal property and will be removed pursuant to MN Statute 345.15 and Crow Wing County Hunting Stand Ordinance. Effective May 1st, County staff will begin removing the stands.

“The County ordinance regulates the use of hunting stands on County managed public lands. The purpose of the ordinance is to minimize damage to trees, promote both public safety and equitable public use of the public land,” stated Kirk Titus, Land Services Supervisor. “In the last couple of months, County Natural Resource Managers have seen a significant number of portable deer stands left on county lands. Individuals, who are not removing their stands, are essentially making a claim or taking ownership for future use of a particular piece of County land. That is a violation of the ordinance.”

The County manages 103,000 acres of forest land for timber production and diverse recreational opportunities for multiple users.
